On the 29<sup>th</sup> of June myself, my mum, and two other boys from the CBS went off from Derry airport to London Gatwick. We then travelled by train to Cambridge Station. After a half hour trip we were there, we hailed in a taxi which took us to the town and from there we walked to Corpus Christi College.

It was an incredibly hot four days with temperatures over 30<sup>o</sup>C . A guest speaker from Costa Rica even commented that it was hotter in Cambridge than where he was from!
