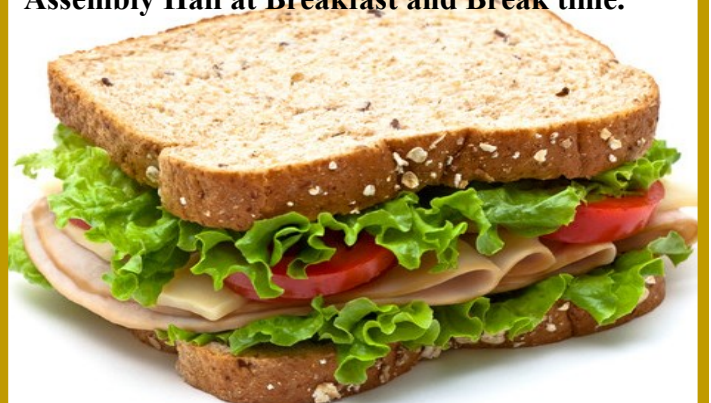

However if you have forgotten medications and have no replacements the school will need to contact a parent / guardian to provide same before you



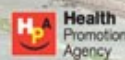
