# CBS Cross Country Challenge

Our athletics coach Mr McFlynn organised an informal, fun cross country race for our athletes against St Michael's Enniskillen coached by Mr Shaw. Teams in Year 8, Year 9 and Year 10 raced around the perimeter of the grass pitches at Coolnagard. The Year 8 race was completed over two laps, 1100m. Aodhan Corry emerged victorious in a very keenly contested race, with the strong St Michael's team placing very well. Superb runs also by Ronan Barton 3rd, Tomas Gallen 5th and Charlie McAleer 7th and Enda Lynch 8th. The Yr9 race was 3 laps, approximately 1600m and Brandon Downey was the star performer of the day with the fastest time of 6mins flat. St Michael's had a very competitive Year 9 team and had a some strong runners who placed highly in the top 10. Pdraig Goodman finished powerfully holding off some determined pace by the opposition to cross the line in 3rd place. The Year 10 race was won convincingly by a determined and dominant Harley Patton who led the whole race right from the start. It was a highly enjoyable cross country event and was a perfect introduction to the sport for some of our Year 8 athletes. It was fantastic to see the boys enjoying the benefit of running outdoors and all their effort and discipline at training being rewarded with good performances.
