## Roald Dahl Quiz Winners

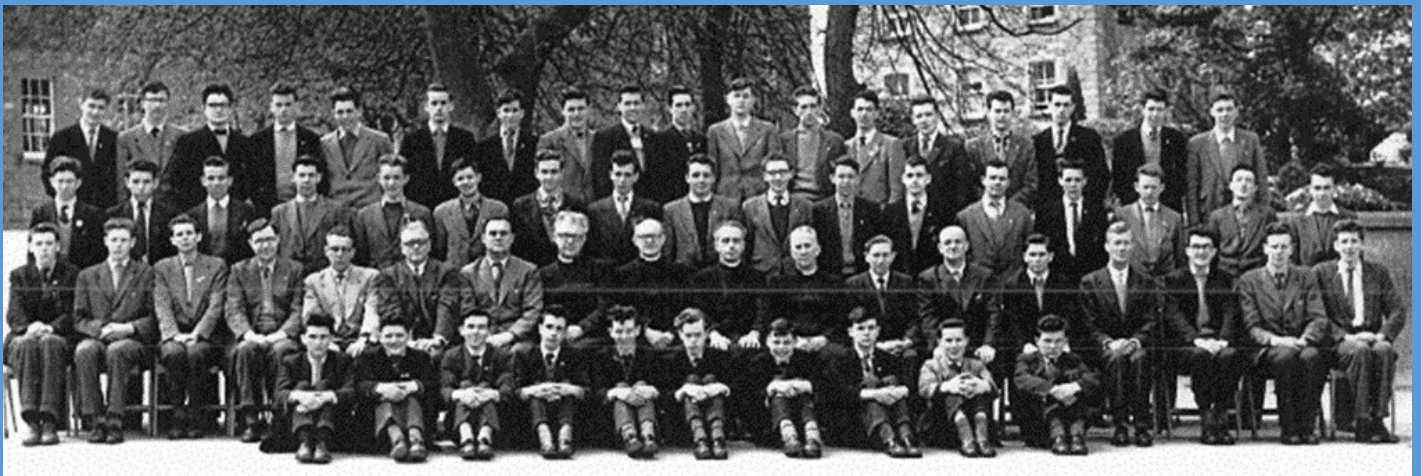
